MTP Act amendment - A Boon to Women Empowerment

Abstract

The MTP Act of 1971 is intended to protect the interest of both the pregnant women and unborn fetus when the situations arises for ensuring a regulated medical termination of pregnancy under certain circumstances. This was initiated to restrict illegal abortion, allowing termination of pregnancy by a medical practitioner in two stages - upto 12 weeks, opinion of one doctor was required and pregnancy between 12-20 weeks, opinion of two doctors was required.

In 2021, parliament amended the law and allowed termination under the opinion of one doctor for pregnancies upto 20 weeks and termination under opinion of two doctors for pregnancies upto 20-24 weeks (rules specified) under section 3B under MTP Act.

Supreme Court Judgment in 2022 - all women entitled to safe and legal abortion not differentiating married and unmarried women. Reproductive autonomy is closely linked to bodily autonomy, the right to choose contraception, the number of children. The consequences of unwanted pregnancy on a woman cannot be undermined and the health of foetus depends on the mental wellbeing of mother. Meaning of Marital Rape solely within the meaning of MTP Act and Rules - married women may form part of a class of survivors of sexual assault and rape as it is quite possible that a woman may become pregnant on account of a non-consensual act by the husband. MTP Act and POCSO Act has to be read harmoniously and there is no need to disclose the identity of minors.
